Call to Order

Approval of Minutes

Geraldine Hall (Secretary) reviewed the March general meeting minutes. Body approved minutes.

Finance Update

Anton Viegas (Treasurer) reviewed the March treasurer's report, including income and expenditures.

Talent show money is 45% to music, 45% to PTA, 10% for tech department. PTA holds funds for the music and tech departments.

Legislative committee update: Laura Rammelsberg

We need insight into the budget and what's in there and what it means to the school system and our school. If anyone is a good budget person, it would be helpful to have a brief synopsis. Please contact Laura or a PTA Board member if you are willing and able to tackle that job.

4/24 county council budget public hearing. Depending on what the budget states, we may want to have a speaker or support the speaker. Also a school board meeting that night. Need notes takers

May 10, at 1:00, is school board meeting—need daytime notes taker, or notes from the video of the meeting Would like to get the legislative priorities (committee meeting in person)

Recess committee: Anna and Anton

Met with principal to discuss that recess takes place, and regularly, and **principal suggests that parents (fingerprinted)** be available to help at recess.

Also in contact with staff person who is running **field day. Volunteers will be needed for that day**. Fingerprinting is required. Suggest driving to Upper Marlboro to get fingerprinting rather than attending a school-based event, which tend to be crowded.

For indoor recess, committee talked about having parents there on inclement days, and Principal Awono has asked teachers for wish lists of games and activities

Halima Jenkins mentioned, that last year we received a grant for indoor recess toys; which were passed out to 3-5th grade classes. This year we received an ACE grant for outdoor help from the City of Greenbelt; however, as toys and equipment wear out, more are always needed. **The City of Greenbelt will help to fix up the playground**, focusing particularly on the rocky areas. They will need help from parents and other community members.

Q: Why can't we use the dance studio for indoor recess?

A: Principal has said there really is no other space for indoor recess and the studio is too small. Kindergarteners have some room in the class, as their rooms are larger than others.

Q: For parent volunteers, how will we recruit them? Suggestion for grandparents. Need also to clarify process for volunteering, need a mechanism. Process is unclear to parents.

Q: Do we know how many parents have the background checks?

A: Halima can ask administration

Q: Can high schoolers use their service hours here? Can we coordinate with local high schools?

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Sometimes list of grandparents.

Comment: what is mechanism? After we know that, we can reach out to specific groups to volunteer

If we can have our dates together, and perhaps have lists to hand out at orientation, it would be helpful. Comments: K parents want to be a part of the culture, and then it doesn't happen, so we're losing parents who would have been involved.

Consider that advance notice is needed for most parents to volunteer.

Q: Is there a renewed policy that parents are now allowed to come to cafeteria

Comment: In the school, there seem to be a group of parents who are not part of the PTA and feel isolated. PTA members know about events, but others do not.

A: all parents can join the general listserv, available through dkfipta.org. You need not be a member of the PTA to be included in that list (the main conduit of communication for the PTA). The only information that members have that others do NOT have is the monthly treasurer's report, and the one survey we compiled this year. All other information, including meeting minutes, is passed out to all on the dkfi listserv.

Comment: For fingerprinting, cost is reduced for those on free or reduced price lunch

A: It is often true that info is disseminated, but not all utilize platforms for access, such as the dkfi listserv.

Q:: can we send out a letter that includes all the the web sites, Twitter address, YouTube, etc., to all student families?

Teacher May 7-11, committee met. Do something every day for teachers and staff. Budget goes almost entirely to luncheon. Also need donations and card writers

Grants Committee needs

Grants: we have multiple grant opportunity. We would love to have folks help out with applying for grants. Ideal opportunity for those who are unable to volunteer in the school meetings

Comment: For cash awards over a certain amount, the county also must receive a portion. Need to clarify what the rules are. It is likely on the web site

Communication discussion (Anton introduced for attendee discussion, comments below brief overview of brainstorming session)

We held off on purchasing the software to facilitate the communication? How can we transition off of the yahoo groups? We do need to improve the system. How is the blackboard system being used?

5 key areas for discussion:

- 1. PTA board to members
- 2. School-wide (sometimes from PTA, sometimes from school)
- 3. Grade-level communications (field trips and homework)
- 4. Teacher to parent
- 5. Parent to parent

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PTA controls, 1 and 5 PTA and parents can influence 2-4

Is Blackboard only via an app? May be losing families who have. No app access

Timeliness is lacking. We (school and PTA) seem to be late in informing parents.

Would be nice to have calendar.

We have teachers who didn't grow up with spirit week, and a tech-knowledge gap, so we need education. Parents have info overload and also LACK of info. Too many apps: for example, class dojo, remind, google class. Need one only (streamlining info stream)

Room parents are underutilized. Perhaps room parents could help teachers with tech

Teachers are not allowed to pass parent contact info onto the class parent; parent must have permission.

Because this is not a neighborhood school, we miss out on the face to face contact. It presents a additional hidererance to communication

Each teacher has his or her preferred means of communication.

School web site is seldom updated.

Suggestion for principal to tell teachers to use ClassDojo, and also a class homework web site. Consistency with perhaps only 2 tools.

Teachers were pushed to use Googlesites, but it's not a good communication tool, so teachers have utilized what they had heard of.

Give families communication info while they are at orientation

How can we support the teachers in communicating better?

Professional development to learn the tech; but parents can also help do the tech work

Sophia brought up again class parent committee, to support the parents in supporting the parents (teachers communicating with parents). Asking Principal Awono to suggest to teachers that they all have a class parent. Have standardized list of what class/grade parent should do.

Perhaps change name from Class "Parent" to Class or Grade "Parent Coordinator" or something so that it is clear what job is (that is, for communication, and not as overarching parent). That roles would be for supplemental communication. Teachers should contact parents directly and remain the main point of contact.

Must encourage teacher to communicate directly with the parents. Parents want to avoid having another layer between teacher and parents.

Group suggests providing the following list to Principal Awono:

Monthly Ed targets Web site updates

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At least 1 parent per grade who can disseminate information Pick one platform (perhaps Class dojo) or gmail

School wide Class wide Calendar

Kindergarten parents offering to help during orientation to guide new parents.

The Board needs to communicate to the membership the name of the communication apps that we had looked at to purchase.

We as parents need to adjust their parent culture; and teachers need to adjust their culture

Parents asked how we can support the teachers, particularly in reaction to the County and state lack of raises.

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
