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Detailed Meeting Notes

Call to Order

7:10 pm

Approval of Minutes

Geraldine Hall (Secretary) reviewed the December general meeting minutes. Body approved minutes.

Finance Update

Anton Viegas (Treasurer) reviewed December treasurer's report, including income and expenditures. Highlights include \$1,039.70 generated through donations made through the Barnes and Noble gift wrapping initiative. Thank you to the volunteers who made that happen. Escrip and Amazon Smile generated \$128.98; thank you to those donors. Restaurant nights generated \$504.23 to date. Many thanks to all who contributed.

Motion to approve finance report passed.

Question: How can people donate directly to a school fund rather than purchase items?

A: M. Awono says it is a nice thought, and he must investigate. Once that information is gathered, the PTA will post it on the Web site. Halima mentioned that all PTA funding goes to the school, students, and staff; M Awono seconded that and said donations to the PTA benefit the school, so that is a good option. Halima noted that through teacher wish lists, families donated 300+ items to teachers, and the PTA has purchased over \$5,000 in requested items. Thank you to the DKFI families and supporters.

The body made and passed a motion to approve the treasurer report.

Special Guest Highlights

Mrs. Emily Wise, our band teacher, introduced the Arts integration (AI) Plan for the school. The entire county is enacting this program; however, DKFI is on the forefront of the rollout. The County's Committee discussed the program. Presenters included John Ceschini, AI Officer; Amy Rosenkrans, PhD, Executive Coordinator for AI; and Marlo Castillo, AI Resource Teacher.

Q: What is arts integration? Why?

- Al is infusion of arts into science and math to heighten learning in memorable ways. Fine tuning curriculum to integrate the arts into other subjects (music, visual, dance, etc.)
- Students are coproducers of knowledge
- Art integration students' test scores actually are rising at Capitol Heights Elementary School, where the program has been piloted.

Currently, the AI program exists in 73 schools. This is the first year it is in all immersion schools.

Attention, attendance, and engagement are increased through arts engagement. Curriculum change is not immediate and across all classrooms. It is a process and a lot of training occurs.

Q: Why is art important? Why do we want our children to take part in a play or play an instrument? Sample parent answers: build community, use other parts of the brain.

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A: Research shows increased critical thinking and problem-solving skills, improved cognition, as evidenced through emerging neuroscience; encouraging an appreciation of diversity; strengthening parent and community engagement

With AI, attendance is better, and referrals to discipline are lower; tolerance (and community) increase—allowing our students to become those 21st century citizens. Ms Wise is the DKFI lead teacher, and receives special training. Ai implementation includes enrichment for teachers, Crayola CreatED Creative Leadership; Arts organization parter partnerships. AI is used to teach students thinking skills, and artful (or deep) thinking.

Parent Q: Do you provide written materials for the classroom? They would be in English. A: We've translated all elements at http://sites.google.com/pgcps.org/artsintegration

The office is also working with the Immersion office so that we can offer connections with French-speaking artists and writers, etc.

Staff training has just started. For example, Mr. Mills has already started. The English team has already started. A team of about 10 teachers is part of the Crayola Leadership group and will spread it through the rest of the teachers. Teachers are looking for natural connections of subjects and topics with the art. Teachers make choices of where a good fit.

Parent Q: How can parents help support this?

A: <u>Money and supply donations would be helpful and always appreciated</u>. Ms. Wise is attempting to stock an arts integration closet. She is also seeking French-speaking artist parent volunteers (fingerprinted). Contact Ms. Wise (nee Shevell) at emily.shevell@pgcps.org if you would like to help.

We have 4 teacher residencies in the works. Ms. Wise applied for and has received grant money from the MD State Arts Council to fund steel drummers coming to the school.

Arts currently include music, dance, drama, visual, and media arts. A parent suggested adding culinary arts

Parent Q: Will there be continued training and support for the teachers as they integrate the arts?

A: Yes. The entire budget of the program is for professional development. Ms. Wise brings the training back to the teachers

Parent Q: When will it be in all classrooms?

A: Each school moves at its own pace. It is the goal that all classrooms include it.

You can ask your teacher how they are using it and offer to assist.

Parent Q: What is the source of funding for the arts teachers?

A: Ms. Wise will investigate and get back to us on funding. We use the resources we have.

Principal's Report

The weather is cold, and the building is cold AND hot. Please send your child to school with clothing for both extremes. We are working on stabilizing the heating and cooling, but it's not perfect.

Students must take their coats back home. The <u>lost-and-found bin</u> is already starting to fill up. When students don't have jackets at bus time, we try to send them back to get their coat, but we cannot catch them all.

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Code of Conduct assembly is on Friday, January 12. This is a mandatory reminder of school rules.

At the end of this month (January 30th), we have someone coming from the <u>French Embassy for professional</u> <u>development</u> (how to use youth literature). This teacher also would like to meet with parents for literacy training from 3:00-4:00. The PTA will have and post details as they are available.

January 17, we have science project fair at the school. Mr. Mills is organizing the event. (UPDATE: due to school weather closing, this event is postponed. New date is TBD.)

In January students in K-2nd grade will have testing. Please plan on full attendance for your students

<u>PSAT 8&9 results are in.</u> Our students did very well. Results will be distributed shortly. Our students learn in French and take test in English. We teach students how to learn; they can be successful in many areas. We also have a fantastic English teacher team who supports us.

Parent Q: Can we call out the birthdays for the summer birthday kids, as we do for the children with birthdays during the school year?
